RE: Trespass and Access to 210 Courthouse Way, Rigby, ID 83442

Ms. Hyde:

This letter is to notify you that, pursuant to Idaho Code § 18-7008, and in the interest of public safety, you are hereby barred from entering the Jefferson County Courthouse and any of its appurtenant offices (including the Annex and Sheriff's Office), facilities, or corresponding property located at 210 Courthouse Way, Rigby, Idaho for a period of one (1) year from the date of this letter. **Unless otherwise provided below, your entry upon the aforementioned property shall constitute a criminal trespass.**

Jefferson County received credible information from the Federal Bureau of Investigation that upon recently having failed to prevail in the courts regarding custody of children, you have threatened to gather 60 – 70 people with guns stand up for their rights and take matters into their own hands. We can only understand this threat to be a threat on the county law enforcement, the judicial branch, the prosecutor's office, and possibly other government agencies located at 210 Courthouse Way if the children are not returned. We must take these statements at face value.

Provided you are able to do the following peacefully and subject to the conditions below, you are granted limited access to the Jefferson County Courthouse as follows:

1. You may attend all hearings for which you are a party and for which you have received notice from the Court. In this event, you may arrive up to 10 minutes early but must depart immediately upon conclusion of the hearing;
2. You may enter to make filings with the Court, but you must depart immediately thereafter;
3. You may enter to make necessary vehicle registration arrangements, driver's license renewals, or payment of property taxes;


4. Any other business you wish to transact with any other county employee or officer (including public records requests) must be done in writing which may be mailed or emailed to the appropriate office for processing;
5. In person meetings may be approved by the county officer conducting the meeting on a case-by-case basis.

If you intend to appear at the courthouse for any of the above reasons, you must call and schedule the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office Dispatch line at (208)745-7521 at least thirty (30) minutes advance notice of your arrival so proper security measures can be taken. Failure to do so or a failure to act in a peaceful manner shall be an unauthorized entry upon the property, for which the county will seek charges of trespass.

You will further note that all firearms, weapons, and incendiary devices are banned from the courthouse and its extensions pursuant to the August 14, 2013 Seventh Judicial District Administrative Order 2013-14-8.

Nothing but your immediate attention and compliance with this notice is required.
