RECOMMENDATIONS FROM the TETON DISTRICT HEALTH OFFICER

STAY AT HOME RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ALL PEOPLE WITHIN TETON COUNTY, WYOMING

RECOMMENDATION #5

It is recommended that all individuals, regardless of age, currently within Teton County, Wyoming, stay at home, in their place of residence, or current place of abode (hereinafter "residence") except as set forth herein. To the extent, individuals are using shared or outdoor spaces when outside their residence, they should at all times and as much as reasonably possible, maintain physical distancing of at least six (6) feet from any other person, with the exception of family or household members, consistent with the Physical Distancing Requirements defined herein. It is recommended that all persons only leave their homes or place of residence for Essential Activities as defined below.

Individuals experiencing homelessness are strongly urged to obtain shelter that meets Physical Distancing Requirements. Individuals whose residences are unsafe or become unsafe, such as victims of domestic violence, are urged to leave their homes and stay at a safe alternative location.

RECOMMENDATION #6

That residents of Teton County, Wyoming who leave the geographic area of the State of Wyoming, Bonneville County, Idaho, and Teton County, Idaho and any visitors that visit Teton County, Wyoming, including the Town of Jackson, from that another geographic area outside of Teton County, WY should limit movement and gathering with other individuals who are not their immediate family upon their return to Teton County, Wyoming. Persons should only leave their residences only to perform any of the following determined to be Essential Activities as defined below for a period of self-quarantine lasting at least fourteen (14) days or self-isolation until any fever or respiratory illness has resolved and they have returned to normal health for at least three (3)days, whichever is longer.

DEFINITIONS

That for purposes of this Recommendation, the following are defined as follows:

Essential Activities:

- a. For Health and Safety: To engage in activities or perform tasks essential to their health and safety, or to the health and safety of their family or household members (including, but not limited to, pets) such as, by way of example only and without limitation, obtaining medical supplies or medication, visiting a health care professional, or obtaining supplies they need to work from home.
- b. <u>For Supplies and Services</u>: To obtain necessary services or supplies for themselves and their family or household members, or to deliver those services or supplies to others, such as, by way of example only and without limitation, canned food, dry goods, fresh fruit and vegetables, pet supply, fresh meats, fish, and poultry, and any other household consumer products, and products necessary to maintain the safety, sanitation, and essential operation of residences.

- c. <u>For Outdoor Activity</u>: To engage in outdoor activity, provided the individuals comply with Physical Distancing Requirements defined herein such as, by way of example and without limitation, walking, hiking, or running.
- d. <u>For Certain Types of Work:</u> i) To perform work at an Essential Business and ii) to perform Minimum Basic Operations at a business not defined as an Essential Business.
- e. <u>To Care of Others</u>: To care for a family member or pet in another household.

Essential Businesses:

- i. Healthcare Operations: Including hospitals, clinics, dentists (for emergency care only), pharmacies, pharmaceutical and biotechnology companies, other healthcare facilities, health-related laboratory services, healthcare suppliers, home healthcare service providers, physical therapy, mental health providers, or any related and/or ancillary healthcare services. "Healthcare Operations" also includes veterinary care and all healthcare services provided to animals. This exemption shall be construed broadly to avoid any impacts on the delivery of healthcare, broadly defined. "Healthcare Operations" does not include fitness, exercise gyms, one-on-one or group trainers.
- ii. <u>Essential Governmental Functions:</u> All services needed to ensure the continuing operation of the government agencies. All Essential Governmental Functions shall be performed in compliance with Physical Distancing Requirements as defined herein, to the greatest extent possible.
- iii. Essential Infrastructure: Includes, but is not limited to, public works, construction, construction of housing or buildings, airport operations, water, sewer, gas, electrical, roads/highways, pathways, public transportation, solid waste collection and removal, internet, and telecommunications systems (including the provision of essential global, national and local infrastructure for computing services, business infrastructure, communications, and web-based services), provided that they carry out these services or that work in compliance with Physical Distancing Requirements as defined by this Order, to the greatest extent possible.
- iv. Stores That Sell Groceries and Medicine: Grocery stores, farmer's markets, food banks, convenience stores, and other establishments engaged in the retail sale of canned food, dry goods, fresh fruits and vegetables, pet supplies, fresh meats, fish, poultry, and any other household consumer products (such as cleaning and personal care products) and specifically includes their supply chain and administrative support operations. This includes stores that sell groceries, medicine, including medication not requiring a medical prescription, and also sell other non-grocery products, wholesale items, and products necessary to maintain the safety, sanitation, and essential operation of residences.
- v. <u>Food Cultivation</u>: Food cultivation, including greenhouses, farming and livestock operations, and fishing.
- vi. Charitable, Religious, and Social Services: Businesses and organizations that provide food, shelter, social services, religious and pastoral services, and other necessities of life for economically disadvantaged or otherwise needy individuals, and individuals who need assistance as a result of this emergency, and people with disabilities.

- vii. Media: Newspapers, television, radio, and other media services.
- viii. <u>Transportation-related business</u>: Gas stations and auto supply, auto repair, and auto-related facilities.
- ix. <u>Financial and Insurance Institutions</u>: Banks, credit unions, appraisers, title companies, insurance companies, and related financial and insurance institutions.
- x. Hardware stores.
- xi. <u>Sporting Good Stores</u>: Sporting goods stores or any stores that sells guns and ammunition.
- xii. <u>Critical Trades</u>: Plumbers, electricians, exterminators, internet or broadband providers, cleaning and janitorial staff for commercial and governmental properties, security staff, operating engineers, HV/AC, painting, cleaning services and others who provide services that are necessary to maintain the safety, sanitation, and essential operation of residences, Essential Activities, and Essential Businesses.
- xiii. Mail, Post, Shipping, Logistics, Delivery, and Pick-Up Services: Post offices and other businesses that provide shipping and delivery services, and businesses that ship or deliver groceries, food, alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages, and goods through commercial or government channels.
- xiv. <u>Educational Institutions</u>: Public and private daycare, K-12 schools, colleges, and universities for purposes of facilitating distance learning or performing essential functions.
- xv. <u>Laundry Services</u>: Laundromats, dry cleaners, and laundry service providers.
- xvi. <u>Restaurants for Consumption Off-Premises</u>: Restaurants and other facilities that prepare and serve food, but only for delivery or curbside carry out, as set forth Teton District Public Health Order #20-2.
- xvii. <u>Transportation</u>: Airlines, airports, taxis, transportation network providers, commercial and public transportation and logistics providers, and other private transportation providers providing transportation services necessary for Essential Activities and other purposes expressly set forth herein.
- xviii. <u>Daycares/Home-Based Care</u>: Businesses and organizations that provide home-based care for seniors, adults, and children, including people with developmental disabilities, intellectual disabilities, substance abuse disorders or mental illness, including nannies who may travel to the individual's home to provide care.
 - xix. <u>Residential Facilities and Shelters</u>: Residential facilities and shelters for seniors, adults, and children, including people with developmental disabilities, intellectual disabilities, substance abuse disorders or mental illness, including nannies who may travel to the individual's home to provide care.
 - xx. <u>Professional Services</u>: Professional services such as legal and accounting services, when necessary to assist in compliance with legally mandated activities.
 - xxi. <u>Funeral Services</u>: Funeral homes, mortuaries, crematoriums, cemeteries, graveyards, and other related services.
- xxii. Liquor: Liquor stores and businesses with a retail liquor license.
- xxiii. Overnight Lodging: Overnight lodging and short-term lodging facilities (including but not limited to hotels, motels, condos, townhomes, single-family residences, guest homes, RV parks, and all camping on public or private lands) within the Teton County, Wyoming that check-in, rent, or lease to Essential Visitors and Primary Residents.

For clarity, businesses and organizations that are not defined herein as an Essential Business should also continue operations consisting exclusively of employees or contractors performing activities remotely and/or consisting of Minimum Basic Operations. All Essential Businesses are strongly encouraged to remain open. To the greatest extent feasible, Essential Businesses should comply with Physical Distancing Requirements as defined herein for both employees and members of the public, including, but not limited to, when any customers are standing in line.

Essential Visitor means any individual renting lodging or camping for an amount of time less than thirty days for the purposes of work within Teton County, Wyoming.

Primary Residents are individuals who:

Rent lodging for periods of thirty days or more;

No matter the length of stay, are in the United States on J1 Visa or similar immigration status;

No matter the length of stay, whose primary address is within Teton County, Wyoming; or

No matter the length of stay, those who are employed at a business in Teton County, Wyoming.

Minimum Basic Operations includes the following, providing that employees comply with the Physical Distancing Requirements as defined herein, to the extent possible, while carrying out such operations:

The minimum necessary activities to maintain the value of the business's inventory, ensure security, process payroll and employee benefits, or for related functions.

The minimum necessary activities to facilitate employees of the business being able to continue to work remotely from their residences.

Physical Distancing Requirements includes maintaining at least sixfoot distancing from other individuals, washing hands with soap and water for at least twenty seconds as frequently as possible or using hand sanitizer, covering coughs or sneezes (into the sleeve or elbow, not hands), regularly cleaning high touch surfaces and not shaking hands.
