

WHEREAS, on August 7, 1969, the Wyoming Open Cut Land Reclamation Act came into effect; and

WHEREAS, the rules and regulations promulgated under this law were to provide for the permitting and reclamation of mineral lands in Wyoming; and

**WHEREAS,** on July 1, 1973, the law was expanded to create the Environmental Quality Act; and

WHEREAS, the Environmental Quality Act's purpose was to enable the state to prevent, reduce, and eliminate pollution; to preserve and enhance the air, water and reclaim the land of Wyoming; and

**WHEREAS,** the Environmental Quality Act established a separate department called the Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality; and

WHEREAS, the Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality was formed to carry out the rules and regulations within the Environmental Quality Act; and

WHEREAS, for 50 years the Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality has fulfilled the vision and intent of its founding leaders; and

WHEREAS, the Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality has carried out its mission since 1973 to protect, conserve, and enhance the quality of Wyoming's environment for the benefit of current and future generations; and

WHEREAS, on this day, the Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality commemorates 50 years of service and dedication to the state of Wyoming.
